

# The Maryland Attorney General on a Naloxone Distribution Program

- Distribution via non-licensed personnel violates state law, but
- "In the context of a proposed public health program ..., a criminal prosecutor or administrative agency could determine that it would not be in the public interest to prosecute possible violations that arose out of a program designed to provide life-saving assistance to a population otherwise difficult to reach. Such an approach may be particularly appropriate when the program is designed as a temporary pilot project to assess its efficacy, and when the results of the pilot program would be available to the Legislature to evaluate the merits of creating statutory authorization for such a program on a more permanent basis. Such determinations could be embodied in a memorandum of understanding among the relevant agencies that carefully defined the circumstances under which the agencies would forgo prosecution."




## The Legal Wildcard






# Risk Preferences and Options 2: High legal risk, good political record







